



Carlisle Cricket Club Health and Safety Statement

Carlisle Cricket Club is fully committed to providing a healthy and safe environment for all its members and will take all reasonably practical steps to provide and maintain the ground and its facilities to a safe operating standard.

It is recognised that due to the club's disposition, health and safety is not the sole responsibility of the committee and that every person using the facilities has a duty in taking care of their own health and safety and that of other users.

The Club will endeavour to arrange to maintain the club facilities to a safe standard so far as is reasonably practicable, and is required to:

- Provide Junior Members with adequate supervision, information and training so that they are aware of any associated hazards whilst utilising the club facilities.
- Encourage members to bring to the attention of the committee any proposals for the improvement in health and safety standards
- Discuss any health and safety issues / concerns at the next committee meeting with a view to a practical resolution being sought.

Carlisle Cricket Club firmly believe that a constant improvement in health and safety standards will only exist if members accept responsibility for their own health and safety and that of others. We should all work as a team to raise awareness of the need for health and safety and ensure that by applying a common-sense approach we maintain the ground and facilities to a safe standard.
